Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s):

Ch.12 App.7 Art.1.8 Causing a collision, repetition of serious mistakes or the appearance of a lack of control over the car (such as leaving the track) will be reported to the Clerk of Course and may entail the imposition of penalties up to and including the disqualification of any driver concerned.

Brief Details:

A number of adverse reports were received from marshal posts about car 333 during the race. These included spins, track limits reports (including a 10s in-race penalty) and alluded to the general standard of driving being observed. The red flag was shown due to an incident, and car 333 was reported to spin under red flag conditions.

The driver of car 333 was interviewed. There was some level of mitigation for the spin under red flags due to other drivers braking more heavily than anticipated.

A penalty of 4 grid places is to be applied to car 333 in the championship's second race.

Accordingly, under Motorsport UK NCR Ch.5a App.5 Art.2.1, I hereby order that you receive the following:
