rainchild of Italian pre-war racer Count
Giovanni 'Johnny' Lurani, Formula Junior
-built around production car engines of
up to 1100cc, which sui-ted FIAT and the
Stanguellini family in Modena which made more than 100
front-engined cars re-sembling miniature Maserati 250Fs
from a dis-tance - debuted in 1958. FJ spread rapidly to
Great Britain, Continental Europe, the USA and Australia, growing in stature to become the pe-eminent training
ground for F1 drivers until it was super-seded by one-litre
F2 and F3 in 1964.

Although F1's rear-engined revolution, pioneered by double World Champion Cooper, with Lotus on its heels, filtered down into the junior school playground, rendering the 'pullers' obsolete, hundreds of manufacturers built cars to the regula-tions, from one-offs to full-scale production runs. Mike Costin and Keith Duckworth's brilliant de-velopment work on Ford engines begat their Cos-worth enterprise - manufacturer of the DFV V8 F1, a debut winner in 1967 with 1960 British FJ champion Jim Clark and Team Lotus. The catego-ry also inspired Jack Brabham and Ron Tauranac's MRD/Brabham cars.

The first single-seater class to be recognised with Historic status in 1975, it has been nurtured glo-bally by the extraordinary Formula Junior Historic Racing Association - under visionary Duncan Rabagliati and his Lithuanian-domiciled daughter Sarah Mitrike - since 1993. Saturday's race is round 10 of the FJHRA's Silverline Tools UK Championship, currently led by Suffolk's Nic Carlton-Smith (Lotus 20) who is aiming to land his fourth crown in five seasons.

Adrian Russell (doubtless anticipating another frontengined Condor duel with Alex Morton), promising youngster Nathan Metcalfe (Lotus 20) and the versatile Chris Porritt (Lotus 18) are emb-roiled in the chase. Defending champion Andrew Hibberd (Lotus 20 or 22), Anglo-Croatian ace Jon Milicevic (Brabham BT6) and Stuart Roach - if he picks his Alexis Mk3 over the frontengined Mk2 - could dispute outright victory.
