Following investigations, I find that you are guilty of contravening the following Motorsport UK NCR(s)

Ch.12 App.8 Art.1.7.m (P) - Failure to comply with Black Light/Flag signals

Brief Details:

Report of car 60 overtaking car 144 under double waved yellows at post 6.
Dave Allan regulations 7.0 state a penalty of Black Flag during qualifying.

The Black Flag was then displayed to the driver three times before the Chequered Flag was shown, but the driver did not come in to the Pits.

Interviewed the driver who was very apologetic as after the overtake he saw the Green Flag and realised he must have done it.

He admitted he did see the Black Flag on the overhead sign but did not see his number.

He had no camera footage to provide mitigation.

I reminded the driver of the Chief Flag signalling location of the Clerks Flags and Board. Also the importance of the Black Flag.

Driver was very apologetic and stated he had learnt from this.

Driver reminded of his Right of Appeal.
