### **Brief Details:**

Contact reported at Camp between cars 7 and 93. Both continued.

Drivers interviewed separately and footage from car 93 reviewed by both drivers. Footage from car 7 was reviewed but did not show footage of the incident.

Driver of car 93 made no input into the steering as car 7 pulled alongside. As car 7 had nearly completed an overtake, contact was made right rear of car 7 to front right with car 93. I deem car 7 to be at fault for the contact.
